Project Description: Sycolin Road will be widened from two lanes to a four-lane divided roadway with a raised median, curb and gutter, a 10-foot wide shared use path, and a 5-foot wide sidewalk, from approximately 1,500 feet north of Claudia Drive to approximately 500 feet south of Tolbert Lane. Turn lanes will be provided at all intersections where appropriate. Traffic signals at the Tavistock Drive and Loudoun Center Place intersections will be modified. Sycolin Road will be resurfaced and restriped from approximately 100 feet south of Claudia Drive to Tolbert Lane to transition to the existing 2-lane typical section.

Purpose and Need Statement: The primary purposes of this project are to:

- Provide adequate roadway capacity and reduce congestion.
- Improve traffic safety.

Provide facilities to accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists.

Traffic volumes have more than doubled since 2010 (VDOT Historic Traffic Data cited in Town scoping documents), and are projected to continue to increase in the future. Construction of residential developments; construction of the Battlefield Parkway; and the paving of Sycolin Road south of Leesburg have all contributed to a rapid rise in traffic on this road. Other factors contributing to the congestion include: the construction of the Leesburg Park and Ride commuter lot immediately south of the project; construction of the Philip Bolen Memorial Park immediately south of the project; and the growth of the Leesburg Executive Airport.

Currently there are no pedestrian or bicycle facilities serving the Sycolin Road corridor between the Leesburg south corporate limits and Tolbert Lane. This area has several large residential subdivisions, a public school, a Loudoun County Park, a community church, and other community facilities. With the completion of the sidewalk and shared use path planned for this project, a continuous pedestrian and bicycle route will be available from Claudia Drive to Gatehouse Drive (approximately 2 miles). These facilities will connect with other sidewalks, shared use paths and trails on Battlefield Parkway, Tavistock Drive, Hope Parkway and other streets to provide a walkable / bikeable network serving this portion of the Town and County.

Comments:

Typical Section: The new typical section will include two 12-foot wide travel lanes in each direction divided by a raised median. The roadway will have standard curb and gutter, a ten-foot wide asphalt shared use path on the east side, and a five-foot wide sidewalk on the west side (see attachment).

Comments: The minority or low-income population of the environmental justice study area does not exceed 50 percent; however the percentage of minority population is above the Environmental Justice (EJ) evaluator factor in Tract 107610604, Block Group 2. Although an EJ population is present, there are no impacts to the EJ population (i.e., no relocations, no displacements, no disruption of community, and no disruption of emergency services). No minority or low-income populations have been identified that would be adversely impacted by the proposed project as determined above. Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of E.O. 12898 and FHWA Order 6640.23, no further EJ analysis is required.

Loudoun County's Philip A. Bohlen Memorial Park abuts the southern end of the project area (to the east), but only repaving and striping is proposed in this area. No impacts on the park are anticipated.

The Loudoun County Department of Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Management is located off Sycolin Road. No response was received during coordination on 4/28/2015.

Under the Leesburg Town Plan, the area is proposed for Office/Light Industrial, Commercial Office, and Regional Office uses, except for the areas occupied by the Philip A. Bohlen Memorial Park (Open Space) and Loudoun County Facilities (Major Institutional). The Town's planning policy for Sycolin Road is that Sycolin Road should be considered a Major Arterial, and proposes specific improvements (Chapter 9, page 9-14). Chapter 3 of the Town Plan establishes an objective to encourage the expansion of the Town's Greenway corridors and trail network to encourage pedestrian and bicycle access to parks and regional trails. The Town Plan Bicycle/Pedestrian Facilities Map shows a multi-use trail along Sycolin Road.

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Comments: VAFWIS Search Report, compiled 3/3/2015, identified the federally-threatened and state endangered dwarf wedge-mussel. However, the VDGIF email response, dated 4/30/15, indicated no impacts are anticipated provided the project is constructed with strict adherence to erosion and sedimentation controls.

The Virginia Natural Heritage Data Explorer project report dated 3/25/2015, and VDCR response letter dated 4/23/15, indicated no state-listed species in the project area.

The USFWS IPaC Species List initially indicated no federally-listed species in the project area. An online certification letter was submitted dated 4/21/15 to the USFWS with no response. The project was re-submitted to the USFWS on 8/3/15 to address the northern long-eared bat, which was listed after submission of the first online certification letter. After informal coordination with the USFWS, the Service determined that the effects of the project on northern long-eared bat will be insignificant and discountable and that the project as proposed is not likely to adversely affect this species.

The improvements will involve minor impacts (50 and 75 linear feet) to the small streams for extension of existing culverts. These impacts should qualify under the terms and conditions of USACE Nationwide Permit #23.
