Vehicle & Equipment Fueling Operations

Vehicle and equipment fueling is a daily tasks in some departments. You can help minimize stormwater pollution from fueling operations by practicing good housekeeping techniques and safe fueling practices. Please post this reminder in your facility. <u>DO:</u>

- Control leaks and spills clean up immediately with a broom or use and absorbent material to trap fluids
- Repair vehicles with leaks immediately - dispose of automotive fluids at a proper location
- Fuel in designated areas only—fueling areas should be on level, impervious surfaces



- Inspect vehicles regularly for leaks and repair leaks immediately
- Dispose of oily or fuel-soaked rags properly
- Provide spill kits and train employees on proper spill cleanup
- Store oil, fuels, solvents and chemicals securely to prevent leaks and spills



DON'T:

- Allow gas, oil or chemicals to drip onto the ground where they can be washed into storm drains or directly into waterways
- Dispose of grease or oils into the sewer system
- Bury spills or hose residue into storm drains
- Top off vehicles or equipment when fueling—this may cause fuel leaks
- Add fuel or oil to power equipment on site without ensuring area can be contained from leaks or spills
- Forget to bring spill kits on site where remote fueling operations may be necessary
- Leave fuel or oil containers unsecured while operating equipment as they may be knocked over and spill or leak
