I. PURPOSE

The Town of Leesburg (the "Town") is soliciting sealed proposals from qualified firms to provide a community fireworks display for the Independence Day Fireworks Celebration held at Ida Lee Park.

II. BACKGROUND

The Town of Leesburg is located 35 miles west of Washington, D.C. The Town encompasses an area of 12 square miles with an estimated population of 51,209. The Town is the largest town in population in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Town Services include; a general aviation airport, police, public works including street maintenance, storm water management, utility services include water, and sanitary sewer, parks and recreation with 18 active and passive parks, and a genealogical library amongst other services.

The fireworks display is held in conjunction with musical performance that includes food vendors. The event takes place at Ida Lee Park in Leesburg, VA (60 Ida Lee Dr. NW). Attendance at the park ranges from 16,000-18,000. This does not count for the number of residents that are outside the park in neighboring housing developments to watch the fireworks.

The firework launch area is in a grass field, surrounded on two sides with mature trees. The crowd line is currently at 1000' from the launch area per Loudoun County Fire Marshall regulations. Access to the area is by vehicle; no special equipment needed.

III. SCOPE OF WORK

The Town's Independence Day choreographed fireworks display is held on July 4th, with a rain date of July 5th. The successful offeror, also referred to as Contractor, shall be mindful of the following:

A. Type of Show

1. The Independence Day fireworks display shall last a minimum of 18 minutes and a maximum of 22 minutes. The show will include a grand finale display. Show must be artistically designed and choreographed, and a time-sequenced script must be approved by the Department of Parks and Recreation.

B. Music

1. The choreographed display should include a variety of patriotic and contemporary music. All music must be reviewed ahead of time by the Department of Parks and Recreation. All equipment needed for playing music and a professional sound system

for the audience will be provided by the Town through a professional sound company who is operating the main entertainment stage.

C. Display and Discharge Criteria

- 1. The display will be fired according to the Loudoun Fire Marshall ordinances and the Virginia Statewide Fire Precaution Code. The show shall be preloaded and computer or mechanically operated in order to electronically fire all shells. The display shall include a distinct opening, and "Grand Finale" closing portion in accordance with the music selected. Shells used in the display shall range from 3-12 inches in size.
- 2. The fireworks display shall be conducted in accordance with the National Fire Protection Association Standard 1123-1990, Public Display of Fireworks and the Loudoun County Fire Marshal's Office requirements for firing a display. All unfired fireworks shall be covered or protected during firing. Any shell not properly fired shall be disposed of in accordance with Loudoun County Fire Marshall Regulations.
- 3. The chief pyro-technician in charge of firing the display shall be at least 26 years of age. The chief pyro-technician shall have a minimum of five (5) years in pyro-technician experience and have fired a minimum of six displays of the size and nature of the displays proposed herein within the previous 12 months. All other assistants shall be at least 18 years of age. A minimum staff of two people shall be provided for the Fourth of July display. The name, address and phone number of the chief pyrotechnician and the assistant(s) shall be provided to the Town of Leesburg with the proposal.
- 4. All fireworks materials shall be clearly marked, indicating the type of shell, and shall be delivered to the site on the day of firing. A representative of the Town shall conduct inspection and inventory of the fireworks shells at least six (6) hours prior to the display being readied for firing. The firing time for the display shall be 9:30 p.m., dependent upon darkness and weather conditions. Arrangements will be made for access to the firing site prior to the date of the event, as requested by the contractor.
- 5. The Contractor shall provide necessary safety equipment, and all tools and materials, including, but not limited to mortar racks, containers, sand, lumber, stakes, etc., which may be required for the firing of the display. Fire extinguishers of appropriate classification and approved as operational shall be accessible and in plain view from the time the fireworks arrive on site until all fireworks are completely removed from the site. The Contractor shall be responsible for being registered with the Loudoun County Fire Marshall's Office and shall be responsible for all fees associated with any registrations.

D. Liquidated Damages

The Town may assess liquidated damages as specified herein that are proportionate and reasonable. These proportionate and reasonable amounts are established as liquidated damages and not as a forfeiture or penalty for the Contractor's failure to comply with the specified terms and conditions. The Contractor hereby waives any defense to the validity of any liquidated damages such as that such liquidated damages are void as penalties or are not reasonable related to actual damages.

- 1. FOR SHELL STORAGE: The Town may assess liquidated damages in the amount of three times the value for the average cost of a shell, by the diameter, for any shell that is shorted, misfired, or those that failed to properly perform.
- 2. FOR CHANGE IN STAFF: The Town may assess Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) if the assigned pyro-technician is changed after the contract for the show is awarded.
- 3. FOR DELAY OR PROGRAM CHANGE: The Town may assess liquidated damages in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the purchase order amount for any delay that results in the display(s) being more than 15 minutes late of scheduled firing time. This amount shall be subtracted from the invoice for payment. The Town may also assess liquidated damages in the amount of ten percent (10%) for failure to provide the program as specified.

E. Firing Method

- 1. All shells shall be preloaded for all displays and electronically fired.
- 2. Computer operation is preferred, but mechanically operated is acceptable.

F. Inclement Weather

- 1. The decision to postpone the fireworks display shall be made by the Director of Parks and Recreation.
- 2. In the event of inclement weather on July 4th of the contract year, the show shall be rescheduled to July 5th of the contract year if necessary.

G. Condition of Site

- 1. The Contractor shall be responsible for removing all firing materials, debris, packing materials, etc., and for filling all holes utilized for firing of the displays.
- 2. All holes left unattended as a result of the postponement of the display shall be marked

with safety ribbon or cones.

- 3. Removal of all materials shall be completed within three hours after the firing of the display.
- 4. The contractor shall walk the fallout zone of the fireworks site the following morning beginning at 6:00 A.M. and shall be responsible for the removal of any unexploded shells and to assist in the cleanup of debris.

H. Ground Protection

1. The Contractor shall provide protection to minimize damage to the area caused by the firing shells.

I. Storage

- 1. The Town of Leesburg shall accept neither responsibility nor liability in connection with the storage of fireworks and/or firing materials.
- 2. The Contractor will be responsible for obtaining appropriate security for any and all materials left onsite during the set-up and break down of the fireworks display.

J. Permits

1. The Contractor shall obtain a fireworks permit from the Loudoun County Fire Marshall's Office for the firing of each display.

K. Licensing

- 1. The Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining a license from the Loudoun County Fire Marshall to conduct firework displays in Leesburg, Virginia.
- 2. The Contractor shall be also be responsible for any fees required to obtain said license.

L. Crowd Control

1. The Town of Leesburg shall provide personnel at the fireworks site for crowd control and site security in accordance with Loudoun County Fire Marshall Regulations.

M. Substitute Shells

1. The Contractor may not substitute shells for the shells listed on the worksheet without <u>prior written approval</u> of the Director of Parks and Recreation.

N. Prime Contractors Responsibility

- 1. The Contractor shall be responsible for completely supervising and directing the setup and discharge of the fireworks displays using its best skills and attention.
- 2. Subcontractors who perform work under this contract shall be responsible to Prime Contractor.
- 3. The Contractor agrees that it is as fully responsible for the acts and omissions of its subcontractors and of persons employed by them as it is for the acts and omissions of its own employees.

O. Subcontractors

- 1. No portion of the work shall be subcontracted without prior written consent of the Director of Parks and Recreation.
- 2. In the event that the Contractor desires to subcontract some part of the work specified herein, the Contractor shall furnish the Director of Parks and Recreation the names, qualifications and experience of their proposed subcontractors.
- 3. The Contractor shall, however, remain fully liable and responsible for the work to be done by its subcontractor(s) and shall assure compliance with all requirements of the purchase order.

IV. PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL INSTRUCTIONS

A. Submittal Instructions

One (1) original (so marked), three (3) hard-copies of your proposal, and one (1) electronic copy of your proposal in USB flash drive format must be submitted to the address on the cover page of this RFP by the date and time noted. Late proposals will not be accepted. Telephone, fax, electronic, emailed and verbal offers will not be accepted.

Submit proposals in a sealed envelope with the following information:

Offerors assume full responsibility for the delivery of the completed proposal to the address noted above on or before the deadline for submission. The Town is not responsible for any loss or delay with respect to the delivery of the proposals. **ANY PROPOSAL RECEIVED BY THE TOWN AFTER THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

B. Proposal Format

Offerors shall submit proposals in the following format:

- 1. Proposals shall include a cover letter, the completed RFP Submission Forms, references, supplemental information, and any other information that you deem appropriate.
- 2. Proposals shall be submitted on 8-1/2" x 11" paper. Proposals are to be prepared simply and concisely. Elaborate artwork, expensive paper, visual, and other presentation aids are not required.
- 3. Proposals shall be signed in ink by the individual or authorized principals of the firm.
- 4. Proposals shall contain no more than seventy-five (75) individual sheets. Double-sided printed pages are encouraged. Note that a sheet printed on both sides is counted as a sheet. All sheets in the proposal (i.e. including covers, dividers and tabs, table of contents, executive summary, etc.) will be counted as part of the sheet count.
- 5. Each copy of the proposal shall be bound or contained in binders, all pages shall be numbered, and shall be organized using tabs in the sequence and format as indicated below:

C. Proposal Organization

Offerors are encouraged to be thorough in addressing the Scope of Work and the Proposal Submittal Instructions as outlined in this RFP. Offerors must fully address each of the following items and submit proposals using the following format:

- 1. **Executive Summary**: Provide a concise description of all work experiences as they relate to the scope of work, including but not limited to: background information about organization (i.e. philosophy, ownership, size, facilities, locations, etc.), management structure, the type of organization you represent (i.e. individual, partnership, corporation, etc.), a detailed history of all mergers and acquisitions, and a copy of the certificate from the State Corporation Commission stating that your firm is authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 2. **Capability and Skill**: Describe the qualifications and skills of the organization and project team to provide the services, including but not limited to: offeror's qualifications to perform the services, qualifications and resumes of team members and other employees who will be managing and performing the services, indicate services to be subcontracted and subcontractor(s) to provide said services, and provide a complete list of all of your clients beginning January 2016. The list must include names, address, and telephone numbers of contact persons as well as a brief description of the work performed.
- 3. **Services Proposed**: Provide a detailed description of the services to be provided under this contract, including but not limited to: overview of the offeror's understanding of the scope of work and services to be provided, provide best practice approaches to the Town that will enhance efficiency and effectiveness, address <u>each</u> of the specific requirements set forth in Section III Scope of Work in order to demonstrate how the proposed solution will meet the specifications requested, and a statement explaining why the offeror's proposed solution would be the most advantageous to the Town. <u>Offerors shall provide a complete description of music and the number and type of shells within the defined parameters of the show.</u>
- 4. Price Proposal: Offeror shall provide proposed fee structure for the Town in the format outlined on the Pricing Form. Price proposal will be itemized by the deliverables outlined in Deliverable in Section III. Proposals should include a description of the relationship between the price and length of program, and a description of the types of fireworks.

5. **Exceptions to RFP**: Detail any exceptions taken to the Scope of Work and Terms and Conditions sections of this RFP. For each exception, specify the RFP page number, section number, and the exception taken.

V. QUESTIONS AND INQUIRIES

Unless otherwise instructed, the Procurement Contact is the sole point of contact for questions concerning this RFP. Questions concerning this RFP must be made in writing to the Procurement Contact listed on the cover page of the RFP. Questions must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 27, 2018.

A formal addendum responding to all questions received by the deadline will be made available no later than five business days before the proposal due date. Additional clarifications to the specifications will also be in the form of a written addendum. All addenda will be posted on the Town's website. Such addenda will become part of the contract documents. Verbal instructions are not binding and will not form a part of the proposal documents. VI. EVALUATION CRITERIA AND AWARD

A. Evaluation Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated on the following criteria and weighted accordingly:

- 1. Qualifications and Experience with other government entities similar to the Town 40%
- 2. Understanding of Scope of Services 25%
- 3. Proposed Pricing 25%
- 4. Overall Completeness and Quality of the Proposal 10%

B. Selection Process

The selected committee will be comprised of users and potential users from various Town departments. The Town Staff will evaluate and rank the proposals using the evaluation criteria stated above and negotiate a contract in accordance with the process for competitive negotiation described in Section 2.2-4302.2 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA) for non-professional services.

The Town reserves the right to accept or to reject any or all proposals in whole or in part and to waive informalities in the process of awarding this contract. The Town further reserves the right to make an award of a contract without further discussion of the proposals received provided it is determined in writing that only one offeror is fully qualified, or that one offeror is clearly more highly qualified and suitable than the others under consideration. Therefore, proposals should be submitted initially on the most favorable terms that the offeror could propose with respect to both price and technical capability.

C. Contract Award

The Town intends to award a contract to a qualified offeror authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth of Virginia with demonstrated experience similar in nature to that being requested herein. The award of a contract shall be at the sole discretion of the Town. Award will be made to the offeror whose proposal is determined to be most advantageous to the Town, taking into consideration the above criteria.

The contents of the proposal submitted by the successful offeror will become a part of any contract awarded as a result of this RFP. The successful offeror shall be expected to sign a contract with the Town. Additional terms and provisions may be included in the contract, a sample copy of which is enclosed.

VII. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Special Terms and Conditions

1. **Contract Term**: The initial term of this annual contract shall commence on a date that is mutually agreed upon both parties and shall continue in force for one year. Upon mutual agreement of both parties, this Contract may be renewed for up to four (4) additional one-year renewal periods.

B. General Terms and Conditions

- 1. **Proposal Binding for One Hundred Twenty (120) Days**: Offeror agrees that this proposal shall be valid and may not be withdrawn for a period of one hundred and twenty (120) calendar days after the due date.
- 2. **Late Proposals**: Proposals received after the time specified on the cover page of this RFP will not be accepted and will be returned unopened, provided a return address is visible.
- 3. **Acceptance or Rejection of Proposals**: The Town reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals in whole or in part and to waive minor informalities in the process of awarding this contract.
- 4. Competition Intended: It is the Town's intent that this request for proposals permits competition. It shall be the offeror's responsibility to advise the Procurement Officer in writing if any language, requirements, specifications, etc., or any combinations thereof, inadvertently restricts or limits the requirements stated in this RFP to a single source. The Procurement Officer must receive such notification at least ten (10) business days before the due date.
- 5. **Understanding of Specifications**: Offerors shall thoroughly examine and be familiar with the Town specifications. The failure or omission of any offeror to receive or examine this document shall in no way relieve any

offeror of obligations with respect to this proposal or the subsequent contract. The submission of a proposal shall be taken as <u>prima facie</u> evidence of compliance with this paragraph.

- 6. **Exceptions to RFP:** Offerors taking exception to any part or section of this RFP shall indicate such exceptions in their proposal. Failure to indicate any exceptions shall be interpreted as the offeror's intent not to fully comply with the specifications as written. Conditional or qualified proposals are subject to rejection in whole or in part.
- 7. **Inquiries Concerning Specifications**: Questions concerning this RFP must be made in writing to the Procurement Contact listed on the cover page of the RFP.
- 8. **ADA Reasonable Accommodation Clause**: If you need any reasonable accommodation for any type of disability in order to participate in this procurement, please contact the Procurement Officer at least ten (10) business days before the proposal due date.
- 9. **Costs Incurred in Responding:** This solicitation does not commit the Town to pay any costs incurred in the preparation and submission of proposals, or to procure or contract for services defined herein.
- 10. **Employment Discrimination Prohibited:** During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
 - a. The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex or national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - b. The contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, will state that such contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
 - c. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting the requirements of this section.

The contractor will include the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs a, b and c in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000 so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

- 11. **Disposition of Proposals:** All materials submitted in response to this RFP will become the property of the Town. One (1) copy of each proposal shall be retained for official files and will become a public record. These records will be available for public inspection after award of the contract. It is understood that the proposal will become a part of the official file on this matter without obligation on the part of the Town except as to the disclosure restrictions contained in Section 12. "Trade Secrets and Proprietary Information Disclosure".
- 12. **Trade Secrets and Proprietary Information Disclosure:** In compliance with the Town's Procurement Policies, all proposals will be available for public inspection. Trade secrets and proprietary information submitted by an offeror in connection with procurement shall not be subject to public disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act. However, the offeror must invoke the protection of this section before or upon submission of the data or other materials, and must identify the specific area or scope of data or other materials to be protected and state the reasons why protection is necessary. An all-inclusive statement that the entire proposal is proprietary is unacceptable. A statement that the costs are to be protected is unacceptable.
- 13. **Laws and Regulations:** The offeror's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable Commonwealth of Virginia laws, municipal ordinances and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over the contract shall apply to the contract throughout, and they will be considered to be included in the contract the same as though herein written out it full.
- 14. **License Requirement:** All firms doing business for the Town are required to be licensed in accordance with the Town's "Business, Professional, and Occupational Licensing (BPOL) Tax" Ordinance. Wholesale and retail merchants without a business location in Leesburg, VA are exempt from this requirement. Questions concerning the BPOL Tax should be directed to the Department of Finance, telephone **703-771-2723**. Indicate the BPOL license number on the proposal form.
- 15. **Ethics in Public Contracting:** The offeror agrees that it will adhere to Article 6 "Ethics in Public Contracting" requirements set forth in the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
- 16. **Safety:** All contractors and subcontractors performing services for the Town are required and shall comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), State and County Safety and Occupation Health Standards and any other applicable rules and regulations. Also, all contractors and subcontractors shall be held responsible for the safety of their employees and any unsafe acts or conditions that may cause injury or

damage to any persons or property within and around the work site area under this contract.

17. **Termination:** Subject to the provisions below, the contract may be terminated by the Town upon thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party. If any work or service hereunder is in progress, but not completed as of the date of termination, then this contract may be extended upon written approval of the Town until said work or services are completed and accepted.

<u>Termination for Convenience</u> – In the event that this contract is terminated or cancelled upon request and for the convenience of the Town, without the required thirty (30) days advance written notice, then the Town shall negotiate reasonable termination costs, if applicable.

<u>Termination for Cause</u>: – Termination by the Town for cause, default or negligence on the part of the contractor shall be excluded from the foregoing provision; termination costs, if any, shall not apply. The thirty (30) days advance notice requirement is waived in the event of Termination for Cause. In the event of default by the offeror, we reserve the right to procure the commodities and/or services from other sources, and hold the offeror liable for any excess cost occasioned thereby. If, however, public necessity requires use of commodities and/or service not conforming to the specifications they may be accepted and payment therefore shall be made at a proper reduction in price.

Termination Due to Unavailability of Funds in Succeeding Fiscal Years — When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal year, the contract shall be cancelled and the contractor shall be reimbursed for the reasonable value of any non-recurring costs incurred but not amortized in the price of the supplies or services delivered under the contract.

- 18. **Non-Assignment of Contract:** The contractor shall not assign the contract, or any portion thereof, without the advanced written permission of the Procurement Officer, such permission not to be unreasonably withheld.
- 19. **Use by Other Localities:** Offerors are advised that the resultant contract may be extended, with the authorization of the offeror, to other public bodies or public agencies or institutions of the United States to permit their use of the contract at the same prices and/or discounts and terms and conditions of the resulting contract. If any other public body decides to use the final contract, the Contractor(s) must deal directly with that public body concerning the placement of orders, issuance of the purchase orders, contractual disputes, invoicing and payment. The Town of Leesburg acts

only as the "Contracting Agent" for these public bodies. Failure to extend a contract to any public body will have no effect on consideration of your bid.

It is the Contractor's responsibility to notify the public body(s) of the availability of the contract.

Other public bodies desiring to use this contract must make their own legal determination as to whether the use of this contract is consistent with their laws, regulations, and other policies.

Each public body has the option of executing a separate contract with the Contractor(s). Public bodies may add terms and conditions required by statute, ordinances, and regulations, to the extent that they do not conflict with the contract's terms and conditions. If, when preparing such a contract, the general terms and conditions of the public body are unacceptable to the Contractor, the Contractor may withdrawal its extension of the award to that public body.

The Town of Leesburg shall not be held liable for any costs or damages incurred by another public body as a result of any award extended to that Public Body by the Contractor.

- 20. **Modification of the Contract:** This contract may be modified by approved a contract modification or change order signed by both parties in accordance with the VPPA.
- 21. **Discrimination Prohibited; Participation of Small and Minority-Owned Business:** The Town shall not discriminate against an offeror because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment.
- 22. **Drug-free Workplace to be maintained by Contractor; Required Contract Provisions:** All public bodies shall include in every contract over \$10,000 the following provisions:

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees to (i) provide a drug-free workplace for the contractor's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor that

the contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

For the purposes of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a contractor in accordance with this chapter, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

- Collusion Among Offerors: More than one proposal from an individual, firm, partnership, corporation or association under the same or different name will be rejected. Reasonable grounds for believing that an offeror has an interest in more than one proposal for the work contemplated will cause rejection of all proposals in which the offeror is interested. Any or all proposals will be rejected if there is any reason for believing that collusion exists among the offerors. Participants in such collusion may not be considered in future proposals for the same work. The signer of the proposal must declare that all persons, companies and parties interested in the contract as principals are named therein; that the proposal is made without collusion with any other person, persons, company or parties submitting a proposal; that it is in all respects fair and in good faith without collusion or fraud; and that the signer of the proposal has authority to contractually bind the offeror. See Offeror Submission Form.
- 24. **Town Employees:** No employee of the Town shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit that may arise there from.
- 25. Qualification of Offerors: Each offeror may be required, before the award of any contract, to show to the complete satisfaction of the Evaluation Team that it has the necessary facilities, abilities, and financial resources to furnish the service or material specified herein in a satisfactory manner, and the offeror may also be required to show past history and reference which will enable the Evaluation Team to be satisfied as to the offeror's qualifications. Failure to qualify according to the foregoing requirements will justify proposal rejection.
- 26. **Liability:** The successful offeror will not be held responsible for failure to perform the duties and responsibilities imposed by the contract due to legal strikes, fires, civil disobedience, riots, rebellions, acts of God and similar occurrences beyond the control of the successful offeror that make performance impossible or illegal, unless otherwise specified in the agreement.

- 27. **Expenses Incurred In Preparing Proposal:** The Town accepts no responsibility for any expense incurred in the proposal preparation and presentation. Such expenses are to be borne exclusively by the offeror.
- 28. **Protest Of Award Or Decision To Award:** An offeror may protest an award or decision to award a contract under procedures as set forth in the VPPA.
- 29. **Ethics In Public Contracting:** This specification incorporates by reference, but is not limited to, the provisions of law contained in the Virginia Conflict of Interest Act, the Virginia Governmental Frauds Act, Articles 2 and 3 of Chapter 10 of title 18.2 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, and the Town Procurement Policy.
- 30. **Faith-Based Organizations:** The Town of Leesburg does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.
- 31. **Insurance Requirements:** Offeror shall secure at its own expense general liability insurance in an amount not less than \$2,000,000 solely contained in a Commercial General Liability Policy or in combination with an Umbrella or Excess Policy. Included shall be coverage for Bodily Injury and Property Damage resulting from the operations, products, and completed operations of the contractor.

Offeror shall also carry automobile insurance in an amount not less than \$2,000,000 solely contained in a Commercial Auto Policy or in combination with an Umbrella or Excess Policy. Offeror shall also carry Workers Compensation insurance, which meets the statutory requirements of the Commonwealth of Virginia. In addition, offeror shall also carry other insurance coverage deemed by the Town to be appropriate to his agreement.

The above-mentioned coverage shall be placed with an insurance carrier licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The carrier must have an AM Best Rating of A or better. A Certificate of Insurance identifying coverage and naming the Town of Leesburg as additional insured shall be furnished to the Town. Liability coverage shall contain wording prohibiting cancellation of coverage, failure to renew, or reduction in limit without the insurer first giving 30 days prior written notice of such action to the Town.

32. **Payment Clauses:** Pursuant to Section 2.2-4354 of the VPPA, within seven days after receipt of amounts paid to the offeror by the Town for work performed by the subcontractor under the resulting contract the Offeror will:

- a. Pay the subcontractor for the proportionate share of the total payment received from the agency attributable to the work performed by the subcontractor under that contract; or
- b. Notify the agency and subcontractor, in writing, of his intention to withhold all or a part of the subcontractor's payment with the reason for nonpayment.

Individual contractors must provide their social security numbers and proprietorships, partnerships, and corporations to provide their federal employer identification numbers.

The offeror will pay interest to the subcontractor on all amounts owed by the offeror that remain unpaid after seven days following receipt by the offeror of payment from the Town for work performed by the subcontractor under that contract, except for amounts withheld as allowed in subdivision 1.

"Unless otherwise provided under the terms of this contract, interest shall accrue at the rate of one percent per month."

The offeror will include in each of its subcontracts a provision requiring each subcontractor to include or otherwise be subject to the same payment and interest requirements with respect to each lower-tier subcontractor.

A contractor's obligation to pay an interest charge to a subcontractor pursuant to the payment clause in this section shall not be construed to be an obligation of the Town. A contract modification shall not be made for the purpose of providing reimbursement for the interest charge. A cost reimbursement claim shall not include any amount for reimbursement for the interest charge.

- 33. **Prime Vendor Responsibilities:** Offerors may propose services that are provided by others, but any services proposed must meet all of the requirements of this RFP. If the offeror's proposal includes services provided by others, the offeror will be required to act as the prime vendor for all such items and must assume full responsibility for the procurement delivery and quality of such services. The offeror will be considered the sole point of contact with regard to all stipulations, including payment of all charges and the meeting of all requirements of this RFP.
- 34. **Purchase Orders:** A purchase order will be enclosed with the resulting contract or will be issued shortly thereafter, and will become an integral part of the resulting contract. The purchase order indicates that sufficient funds have been obligated as required by Title 15 of the Code of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and assures distribution of the necessary receiving reports. The purchase order does not supersede any provisions of

the resulting contract. Performance time and dates are determined solely by the contract and any modification thereto. Services are not to begin until receipt of the purchase order and/or other notification by the Town's Procurement Officer or designee.

6. Applicable Law and Courts. This Contract shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the Circuit Court of Loudoun County. The Contractor shall comply with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.

- **Assignment of Contract.** This Contract shall not be assignable by the Contractor in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the Town.
- **8.** Audit. The Contractor shall retain all books, records, and other documents relative to this Contract for five (5) years after final payment, or until audited by the Town, whichever is sooner. The Town, its authorized agents, and/or State auditors shall have full access to and the right to examine any of said materials during said period.
- **Indemnification.** Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Town, its officers, agents, and employees from any claims, damages and actions of any kind or nature, whether at law or in equity, arising from or caused by any services of any kind or nature furnished by the Contractor, provided that such liability is not attributable to the sole negligence of the Town.

11. <u>Termination</u>

Specifically, the Town may not, through its contractual and/or financial arrangements, directly or indirectly avoid compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, Public Law 101-336, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by public entities. Subtitle A protects qualified individuals with disability from discrimination on the basis of disability in the services, programs, or activities of all State and local governments. It extends the prohibition of discrimination in federally assisted programs established by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 Section 504 to all activities of State and local governments, including those that do not receive Federal financial assistance, and incorporates specific prohibitions of discrimination on the basis of disability in Titles I, III, and V of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Virginians with Disabilities Act of 1990 follows the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 Section 504.
- **14.** <u>Faith Based Organizations.</u> The Town does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.

seven (7) day period except for amounts withheld as allowed in item b. Unless otherwise provided under the terms of this Agreement, interest shall accrue at the rate of one percent (1%) per month. The Contractor shall include in each of its subcontracts a provision requiring each subcontractor to include or otherwise be subject to the same payment and interest requirements as set forth above with respect to each lower-tier subcontractor. The Contractor's obligation to pay an interest charge to a subcontractor pursuant to this provision may not be construed to be an obligation of the Town.

- Authority to Transact Business in Virginia. A Contractor organized as a stock or nonstock corporation, limited liability company, business trust, or limited partnership or registered as a registered limited liability partnership shall be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a domestic or foreign business entity if so required by Title 13.1 or Title 50 of the Code of Virginia or as otherwise required by law. Any business entity described herein that enters into an Agreement with the Town pursuant to the Virginia Public Procurement Act 2.2-4300 et seq. shall not allow its existence to lapse or its certificate of authority or registration to transact business in the Commonwealth, if so required under Title 13.1 or Title 50 of the Code of Virginia, to be revoked or cancelled at any time during the term of the Agreement. The Town may void any Agreement with a business entity if the business entity fails to remain in compliance with the provisions of this section.
- **Counterparts.** This Contract and any amendments or renewals hereto may be executed in a number of counterparts, and each counterpart signature, when taken with the other counterpart signatures, is treated as if executed upon one original of this Contract or any amendment or renewal. A signature by any party to this Contract provided by facsimile or electronic mail is binding upon that party as if it were the original.
- **Ethics in Public Contracting**. The provisions contained in Sections 2.2 4367 through 2.2 4377 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act as set forth in the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, shall be applicable to all Contracts solicited or entered into by the Town. A copy of these provisions may be obtained from the Town upon request.

The above-stated provisions supplement, but do not supersede, other provisions of law including, but not limited to, the Virginia State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act (§ 2.2-3100 et seq.), the Virginia Governmental Frauds Act (§ 18.2 498.1 et seq.) and Articles 2 and 3 of Chapter 10 of Title 18.2. The provisions apply notwithstanding the fact that the conduct described may not constitute a violation of the Virginia State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act.

on a construction project. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the Contractor from including its own sales tax expense in connection with the Contract in its Contract price.

21. Employment Discrimination by Contractors Prohibited

- A. During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:
 - 1. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, status as a service disabled veteran, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - 2. The Contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, shall state that such Contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
 - 3. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient to meet this requirement.
- B. The Contractor will include the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs, 1, 2, and 3 in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

22. Drug-free Workplace

During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor agrees to (i) provide a drug-free workplace for the contractor's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor that the contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

For the purpose of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a contractor in accordance with this chapter, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the Contract.

- 23. <u>Delays and Delivery Failures</u>. Time is of the essence. The Contractor must keep the Town advised at all times of status of parties' agreement. If delay is foreseen, the Contractor shall give immediate written notice to Town. Should Contractor fail to deliver the proper item/service at the time and place contracted for, or within a reasonable period of time thereafter as agreed to in writing by the Town, or should the Contractor fail to make a timely replacement of rejected item/service when so required, the Town may purchase item/service of comparable quality and quantity in the open market to replace the undelivered or rejected item/service. The Contractor shall reimburse the Town for all costs in excess of the Contract price when purchases are made in the open market; or, in the even that there is a balance the Town owes to the Contractor from prior transactions, an amount equal to the additional expense incurred by the Town as a result of the Contractor's nonperformance shall be deducted from the balance as payment.
- **24.** <u>Substitutions</u>. No substitutions, additions or cancellations, including those of key personnel, are permitted after Contract award without written approval by the Town. Where specific employees are proposed by the Contractor for work, those employees shall perform the work as long as those employees work for the Contractor, either as employees or subcontractors, unless the Town agrees to substitution. Requests for substitutions shall be reviewed and may be approved by Town at its sole discretion.
- 25. Workmanship and Inspection. All work under this Contract shall be performed in a skillful and workmanlike manner. The Contractor and its employees shall be professional and courteous at all times. The Town reserves the right to require immediate removal of any Contractor employee from Town service it deems unfit for service for any reason, not contrary to law. This right is non-negotiable and the Contractor agrees to this condition by accepting this Contract. Further, the Town may, from time to time, make inspections of the work performed under the Contract. Any inspection by the Town does not relieve the Contractor of any responsibility in meeting the Contract requirements.
- **Contractual Disputes.** The Contractor shall give written notice to the Procurement Officer of intent to file a claim for money or other relief within ten (10) calendar days of the occurrence giving rise to the claim or at the beginning of the work upon which the claim is to be based, whichever is earlier.

The Contractor shall submit its invoice for final payment within thirty (30) days after completion or delivery.

The claim, with supporting documentation, shall be submitted to the Procurement Officer by US Mail, courier, or overnight delivery service, no later than sixty (60) days after final payment. If the claim is not disposed of by agreement, the Procurement Officer shall reduce his/her decision to writing and mail or otherwise forward a copy thereof to the Contractor within thirty (30) days of the Town's receipt of the claim.

The Procurement Officer's decision shall be final unless the Contractor appeals within thirty (30) days by submitting a written letter of appeal to the Town Manager, or his

designee. The Town Manager shall render a decision within sixty (60) days of receipt of the appeal.

No Contractor shall institute any legal action until all statutory requirements have been met. Each party shall bear its own costs and expenses resulting from any litigation, including attorney's fees.

- **Severability**. In the event that any provision shall be adjudged or decreed to be invalid, by a court of competent jurisdiction, such ruling shall not invalidate the entire Contract but shall pertain only to the provision in question and the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid, binding and in full force and effect.
- **28. Force Majeure**. A party will not be held responsible for failure to perform the duties and responsibilities imposed by the contract due to legal strikes, fires, civil disobedience, riots, rebellions, acts of God and similar occurrences beyond the control of the party that make performance impossible or illegal, unless otherwise specified in the Contract.

If a party asserts Force Majeure as an excuse for failure to perform the party's obligation, that party must immediately notify the other party giving full particulars of the event of force majeure and the reasons for the event of force majeure preventing that party from, or delaying that party in performing its obligations under this contract and that party must use its reasonable efforts to mitigate the effect of the event of force majeure upon its or their performance of the contract and to fulfill its or their obligations under the contract.

An event of force majeure does not relieve a party from liability for an obligation which arose before the occurrence of that event, nor does that event affect the obligation to pay money in a timely manner which matured prior to the occurrence of that event.

The Contractor has no entitlement and Town has no liability for: (1) any costs, losses, expenses, damages or the payment of any part of the contract price during an event of force majeure; and (2) any delay costs in any way incurred by the contractor due to an event of force majeure.

- **29.** <u>Survival of Terms</u>. Upon discharge of this Contract, Sections (Notice, Indemnification, Governing Law/Forum, Contractual Disputes) continue and survive in full force and effect.
- **Insurance**. Contractor shall secure at its own expense general liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 solely contained in a Commercial General Liability Policy or in combination with an Umbrella or Excess Policy. Included shall be coverage for Bodily Injury and Property Damage resulting from the operations, products, and completed operations of the contractor.

Contractor shall also carry automobile insurance contained in a Commercial Auto Policy or in combination with an Umbrella or Excess Policy. Contractor shall also carry Workers Compensation insurance, which meets the statutory requirements of the Commonwealth of Virginia. In addition, Contractor shall also carry other insurance coverage deemed by the Town to be appropriate to this agreement.

The above-mentioned coverage shall be placed with an insurance carrier licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The carrier must have an AM Best Rating of A or better. A Certificate of Insurance identifying coverage and naming the Town of Leesburg as additional insured shall be furnished to the Town. Liability coverage shall contain wording prohibiting cancellation of coverage, failure to renew, or reduction in limit without the insurer first giving 30 days' prior written notice of such action to the Town.

- **Parties' Relationship**. It is the intent of the parties hereto that the Contractor shall be considered as an independent contractor and that neither it nor its employees shall, under any circumstances, be considered servants or agents of the Town and that these bodies shall be at no time legally responsible for any negligence on the part of said Contractor, its servants or agents, resulting in either bodily or personal injury or property damage to any individual, firm, or corporation.
- **Ownership of Documents.** Contractor agrees that all information, finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, surveys, specifications, records, reports and other material gathered and/or prepared by or for it under the terms of the Contract shall, at the Town's option, be delivered to, become, and remain the property of the Town. The Town shall also have the right to use and reproduce the data and reports submitted hereunder, without additional compensation to the Contractor.
