# Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission 8 March 2023 Library Director's Report

#### **Activities:**

## **Lectures and Author Talks, Classes, Tours & Other Activities:**

- Requests for speaking engagements Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 have started to come in.
- Registration for all events required; to facilitate registration a Season Ticket option is available on our event registration page.
- 22 March 2023, TBL hosts the Ulster Historical Foundation all-day genealogical seminar. Registration in advance \$30 for members of Friends of TBL; \$40 for nonmembers; at door \$60 should seats be available. To date over 50 registrations have been received.

#### **Publications/Products:**

- TBL's electronic resources brochure with the advent of Thomas Balch Library's Centennial Catalog this brochure will no longer be issued as all information is accessible through the catalog.

## **Building and Grounds:**

- Handrail for rebuilt ADA ramp has been constructed; painted and arrangements are being made for delivery and installation.
- In January 2021 there was a Leesburg-wide power failure. I took the opportunity
  to check emergency lighting throughout the building and found a number of
  units were not working. Subsequent investigation by Buildings staff indicates
  that the second or emergency line was never installed. Battery backup
  emergency lights are being installed.

# **Disaster and Emergency Preparedness:**

 Anna Carneal, after meeting with Alex Fitch, the emergency management coordinator, will be creating a quick emergency check list for staff while the full manual will be utilized as a training tool.

#### Outreach:

Outreach for February included Laura and Alexandra attended a virtual interest meeting for the Local and Family History Forum of the Virginia Library Association. TBL hosted a class visit and tour from George Oberle and Cindy Kerner's George Mason University historical methods class on during evening hours on with Alexandra introducing the

Library to the class and Laura managing the class. Throughout the month TBL staff continued to assist students with their research. Alexandra and Laura C met with the new Loudoun Museum Director Carrie Christoffersen and provided a tour of the library. Laura attended MARAC steering committee and conference planning meetings. The Library Director participated in the February Loudoun County VA250 committee meeting. Maddie participated in weekly meetings with the OCLC WMS Cohort for cataloging and Laura and Gressitt joined Maddie in participating in meetings with OCLC management relating to the contract and progress

In addition to assisting with inquiries and projects from TOL staff, TBL staff also collaborated with educators at Elaine Thompson Elementary School, the Loudoun County office of Mapping and Planning, and the Loudoun Heritage Farm Museum. Two long-term collaborative projects featuring Thomas Balch Library collections debuted this week. The Loudoun County Office of Mapping and Geographic Information published Loudoun County History: The Edds, Ewing, and Nokes Families, an online story map featuring recorded excerpts of the 2002 interview of Carrie Elizabeth Nokes from the Black History Committee Oral History Collection. The Loudoun Heritage Farm Museum opened Just Country Living: Nokesville and the Nokes Manure Spreader, a new exhibition focused on the history of Loudoun's Black villages and a recently restored manure spreader once owned by the Nokes family.

# **Collections: February 2023 Activity:**

**Accessions:** 5 gifts were accessioned including additions to existing collections: Loudoun Revolutionary War Memorial Committee Collection, 20022016 (M140); Leesburg Garden Club Collection, 1920 - (M 044) and the Town of Leesburg records.

Published materials included a copy of *Collier's New Photographic History of the World's War* – 1918 and 19 issues of *The Oatlands Column* 1987-1994.

# Digital Collections, Computers, and Microfilm: 0

**Manuscript and Visual Collections:** 0 Manuscript collections were processed; 177 photographs were processed; 0 records were uploaded to the Past Perfect catalog which currently holds 7,270 images.

**Printed Collections:** A total of 255 items were catalogued or inventoried: 167 items were added to the new TBL Centennial catalog by Maddie Russell; 19 periodicals were inventoried for the catalog by TBL staff; 59 newspapers were received and inventoried, 0 books/periodicals were sent to LCPL and 10 books/periodicals were returned by Loudoun County Public Library cataloging since the last report to the Commission. Books of note returned from Cataloging include: *Capitalism and Slavery* by Eric Williams; *Regular Baptists in Colonial Anglican Virginia: Civil Disobedience During Religious Toleration* by Laverne Young Smith and *Picturing Us: African American Identity in Photography* by Deborah Willis.

**Vertical Files (VF):** Additions/updates to the microform index (0) ephemera files (0), vertical files (0) unpublished papers (0); family files (0) and maps (0). Anna Carneal is working on a collection guide for the family files and a Volunteer, Ann Geiger, is assisting in re-foldering the materials.

**Catalog Project:** Is progressing smoothly; backlogged items are being cataloged and prepped for uploading to OCLC TBL is now able to catalog materials for the new catalog which should go live in June. All materials have been collected from LCPL and no more will be sent. Circulation of materials has stopped. The catalogue is expected to go live for staff to review in April and live for the public in June. We anticipate being able to sunset the TBL -LCPL catalog the end of June.

- Don Cooper, President of the Friends of TBL gave the Friends' report—Chronicle, the
  Friends newsletter, has been sent out—the next board meeting will be 21 March and
  will focus on planning for the September fundraiser, which will be held at Dodona
  Manor
- Alexandra Gressitt gave the report for the TBL Foundation Board—the tax information
  has been filed—the foundation is in receipt of a donation of \$2500—the next meeting is
  21 March at noon at Balch
- Under Old Business—the library director gave a full report on the progress of the recatalog project, illustrating how it will make the library's resources far more available and useful to researchers—at the current rate of progress, it should be completed by June—the commission chair reported that no new work was in progress at the Potter's Field memorial site, except for markers denoting the perimeter of the site—the library director reported the obelisk marker is here and that plans have been made for site development—the memorial tree and plaque honoring Martha Schonberger should be ready for presentation this spring or summer.
- Under New Business—there was discussion of how to place items on the commission's agenda—the library director requested that any items be entered at least a week prior to the meeting, if possible
- Commission's comments followed with most focusing on the upcoming Boards & Commissions event on 30 March—commissioners were encouraged to attend.
