Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission 12 July 2023 Library Director's Report

Activities:

Exhibits: Town press releases and postings to social media are issued for events.

Lectures and Author Talks, Classes, Tours & Other Activities:

- Events have been scheduled for Fall 2023 and events are in the planning stages for Spring 2024.
- Pre-registration will continue to be required for all events to prevent confusion for hybrid or virtual presentations. Unless there is no room to accommodate those who don't pre-register, no one will be turned away.
- Linda Sittig presented on her recent book Opening Closed Doors on the integration of the Purcellville Library. It was an outstanding presentation with 45 in attendance on Sunday June 25.

- 7 September 2023 @ 10AM Shannon Combs- Bennett will present on Genealogy in the 21st Century: Using DNA to Aid Your Paper Research.

Outreach: Outreach for June included Laura participating as a judge at National History Day in College Park Maryland, manning an information table about TBL with Anna Carneal at the Inspire Loudoun Educator's Conference at Riverside High School; participating in a Historians on Tap program in Middleburg and attending a virtual planning meeting for the Shenandoah Valley Archives Fair. TBL staff collaborated or provided assistance to Town of Leesburg staff from the Public Information Office, Utilities, and Parks and Rec departments as well as Loudoun County Historic Court Records, Virginia Piedmont Heritage Association, and Loudoun County Public Schools staff in June.

Collections: June 2023 Activity:

Accessions: 8 gifts were accessioned.

Acquisitions of note accessioned in June included Michael R. Napper's Funeral Program, May 9, 2023, materials from the estate of J. Martz a former clerk of court for Loudoun, and photographs and other materials related to Anna Hedrick.

Additions to existing collections were also received including records of the Friends of Thomas Balch Library and the Town of Leesburg.

Published materials included *Through the Mountains: The French Broad River and Time by John Ross*; the 2004 Loudoun *County African-American Historic Architectural*

Resources Survey by History Matters, LLC and The Catoctin Farmers' Journals, Volume 1 by Eugene Scheel.

Digital Collections, Computers, and Microfilm: 0

Manuscript and Visual Collections: 0 Manuscript collections were processed; 0 photograph was processed; o records were uploaded to the Past Perfect catalog which currently holds 7,270 images.

Printed Collections: 118 items were cataloged; 0 items were added to the new TBL Centennial catalog by Maddie Russell; 30 periodicals were inventoried for the catalog by Echo; 88 newspapers were received and inventoried by staff, 0 books/periodicals were sent to LCPL, and 0 books/periodicals were returned by Loudoun County Public Library cataloging since the last report to the Commission.

Vertical Files (VF): Additions/updates to the microform index (0) ephemera files (0), vertical files (0) unpublished papers (0); family files (0) and maps (0). Anna Carneal is working on a collection guide for the family files and a Volunteer, Ann Geiger, is assisting in re-foldering the materials.

Catalog Project: As of July 1, the library is operating its own catalog: Thomas Balch Library Centennial Catalog. All public facing books have been relabeled and shifted. Educational handouts have been prepared, posts have been made on social media and etc. The Library closed to the public June 26-30 to reorder and shift the books. It was an outstanding experience – staff and volunteers worked together efficiently, compatibly and in three days the books were on the shelf leaving us two days for cleanup. Staff who participated in implementation of the catalog were recognized with a spot award and volunteers were acknowledge with a thank you letter. To date we have had positive and excited feedback on our change.

LCPL cataloged 17 books for TBL the first quarter of FY 23, for the second quarter FY23 cataloging was on hold by OCLC; for the third and fourth quarters of FY23 4,598 extant records created by LCPL were corrected and 737 new records were added to the new catalog.

The contract with LCPL was not renewed and LCPL will eliminate our records from their catalog in the near future. We will continue to work cooperatively with LCPL in any way we are able.

In the coming months conversion work will continue on the professional and rare book collections; periodicals will be reviewed to ensure accuracy of records during conversion process (these records had been suppressed in the LCPL catalog). There will be other cleanup activities to make review maps, digital, archival and etc. to be certain links from catalogue records to guides and indices are working effectively.

As a consequence of this accomplishment a change in the way TBL keeps statistics will be noted with the July report. We anticipate further changes to our website to facilitate collection access.

Personnel:

Interns/Student Researchers: while we received two inquiries about internships over the summer months, we interviewed one applicant who will start later this summer.

Staff: Staff is to be highly commended for their effort to effect the change in our cataloging system.

News of Former Staff:

Volunteers: Work on a variety of projects such as scanning and numbering photographs and prepping collections for processing, though primary focus is the Cataloging Project. Wynne Saffer; Morgan Dunwoody; Kate Nau; Sue Cordek, Travis

Russell and Pauline Clark, a member of the board of Friends of the TBL, assisted us with the catalog project.

The annual thank you for the volunteers was held on June 21 12:30-2PM. The first since COVID. Everyone had a great time. We hope to return to our April time frame for acknowledging the volunteers.

Building Use: Laura has prepared the Donaldson Cabin on Loudoun Street for processing collections and is scheduling flex staff and volunteers to work in the cabin. There will be participation in First Fridays July through October.

Action Items:

• Dedication of the dogwood tree: contact has been made with the family for a date in the fall.

Virtual Participation: Billigmeier requested to attend the meeting virtually, a motion in favor was moved by Coyer, seconded by Woolard and unanimously approved.

Minutes: Minutes of the regular commission meeting of 10 May and 14 June 2023 were approved on a motion by Coyer and a second by Woolard.

Thomas Balch Library Endowment Foundation: Gressitt, Secretary/Treasurer reporting

 Next meeting of the Foundation is 18 July 2023 @ 12 noon at Thomas Balch Library.

Old Business:

Gressitt reporting on the Catalog Project noted the successful completion of the
conversion from Dewey to Library of Congress classification and the launching of
a new catalog Thomas Balch library Centennial Catalog. Handouts, including a
map showing location of books, an instruction sheet on using the catalog and a
bookmark with LC classification numbers was distributed. A motion commending
the Library Director and recognizing her efficient and highly professional

- management and direction of the catalog project moved by Coyer, seconded by Woolard, passed unanimously.
- Memorial tree for Martha Schonberger: Gressitt reported on the status. A fall date is anticipated.
- Land Acknowledgement landmark was briefly discussed and carried forward for further discussion as information arises.

New Business:

- A motion commending the Library Director and recognizing her efficient and highly professional management and direction of the catalog project moved by Coyer, seconded by Woolard, passed unanimously.
- History Awards review team of two commissioner members, Baracat-DonovanDo and Woolard was selected to review nominations with the Library Director. The Library Director was given the go ahead to the award process for 2023 including publicity.
- Following a brief discussion of St James' historic cemetery, Billigmeier and Coyer expressed interest, should their schedules permit, in attending the 1PM 26 July 2023 meeting, called by Thomas Horne, to be held at TBL.
- A motion approving the annual report for the TBLAC as prepared by the Chair moved by Woolard, seconded by Dias-Mattina, passed unanimously.
- Both Coyer and Hershman made requests to attend the August 9 meeting virtually. A motion in favor of Coyer and Hershman attending the August 9 meeting remotely, moved by Woolard, seconded by Baracat-Donovan, passed four in favor with two, Coyer and Hershman, abstaining.
- Hershman shared information regarding an upcoming meeting chaired by Carl Rush, Loudoun County Equity Officer and a research team from UVA to be held at TBL, 9AM to 1PM on Monday July 24. Members of the Black History Committee and TBL staff have been included in this meeting. Library and BHC resources regarding will be used to better understand the impact of school desegregation on members of the African American community in Loudoun County. The group will also be meeting at the newly reopened Douglass High School. Coyer expressed interest in attending this meeting.

Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission

- Commission voted unanimously to allow Commissioner Scott Billigmeier to participate remotely
- Approved the minutes of the 10 May meeting
- Received the library director's report—the town council has changed the process for creating Proclamations, which could affect the commission's future proclamations—the director gave an update on the cataloguing project, noting the actions regarding the books had been completed (by staff assisted by numerous volunteers)—the organizing method, the Library of Congress system, is much easier for patrons to find materials, as well as being an internationally used cataloguing system—also the library's use of the Donaldson Cabin for exhibits has drawn a sizable crowd on First Fridays
- Don Cooper, President of the Friends of Balch, reported that compiling the Newsletter for Summer is underway--planning for the 10 September fundraiser is coming along well
- Alexandra Gressitt reported that the next TBL Foundation Board meeting will be on 18
 July—it will consider a better method for transferring significant archival materials or
 donations to the endowment—also routine tax services and small expenditures are on
 the agenda
- Under Old Business the commission had further discussion of advocacy for an historical marker that would note the indigenous people who lived in the town's region prior to European settlement
- Under New Business the commission unanimously adopted a resolution of thanks to
 Alexandra Gressitt, the Library Director, for her efficient and highly professional
 management of the library re-cataloguing project—the commission also voted
 unanimously to allow Commissioners James Hershman and Paul Coyer to remotely
 participate in the 9 August meeting—the matter of the restoration of the St. James
 Church cemetery came up for discussion, with the commission expressing interest and
 desirous of acquiring more information on the project in the future
- In commissioner's comments, Commissioner Hershman reported that a team from the University of Virginia was coming in July to research the school desegregation and civil rights history of Leesburg and Loudoun. The library director will be providing them a tour and information session on Balch's resources on 24 July Meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
