Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission 09 August 2023 Library Director's Report

Activities:

Exhibits: Town press releases and postings to social media are issued for events.

- Events have been scheduled for Fall 2023 and events are in the planning stages for Spring 2024.

Outreach: Outreach for July included Laura with flex staff and volunteers hosting a popup exhibit about 18th century Leesburg at the Donaldson Cabin; Laura attending Lucketts History Fair organized by Virginia Piedmont Historical Association and Lucketts Ruritan. Laura consulted with Lucketts Ruritan members throughout the month about their efforts to start an oral history project in Lucketts. Alexandra welcomed and Laura attended, a meeting organized by Chief Equity Officer for Loudoun County Carl Rush with researchers from UVA and BHC members related to researching segregation in Loudoun County. Additional outreach included Laura appearing in two "Live in Leesburg" Town of Leesburg Spots, one on 7/7 and one, with Alexandra on 7/28. Alexandra coordinated, scheduled and attended a multi organizational meeting on St. James' Cemetery. TBL staff collaborated or provided assistance to Town of Leesburg staff from multiple departments, as well as with Loudoun County Historic Court Records, Clarke County Historical Association and the Virginia Piedmont Heritage Association in July.

Collections: July 2023 Activity:

Accessions: 10 gifts were accessioned.

Acquisitions of note accessioned in July included donation of a press photograph of a temporary morgue at Union Cemetery following an air crash in Blue Ridge Foothills 6/15/1947, and an addition of promotional materials from the Middleburg Bank.

Additions to existing collections were also received including additions to the Loudoun County, VA Cemetery Collection, 1990- (M 017) and to the Preservation Society

of Loudoun County Collection, 1973 -2006 (M 068) as well as to the records of the Friends of Thomas Balch Library and the Town of Leesburg.

Published materials included *Opening Closed Doors: The Story of Josie C. Murray* by Linda Sittig Harris, Linda Jackson King, and Whitney Truitt; *Stony the Road* by Henry Louis Gates, Jr. and *The Story of Reconstruction* by Robert Selph Henry; *and* A copy of *Clarke County, Virginia: History through Architecture* by Maral S. Kalbian.

Digital Collections, Computers, and Microfilm: 0

Manuscript and Visual Collections: 0 Manuscript collections were processed; 3 photographs were processed; 0 records were uploaded to the Past Perfect catalog which currently holds 7,270 images.

Printed Collections: 165 items were cataloged; 66 items were added to the Centennial catalog; 37 periodicals were inventoried for the catalog; 62 newspapers were received and inventoried.

Vertical Files (VF): Additions/updates to the microform index (0) ephemera files (0), vertical files (0) unpublished papers (0); family files (0) and maps (0). Anna Carneal is working on a collection guide for the family files and a Volunteer, Ann Geiger, is assisting in re-foldering the materials.

Catalog Project: As of July 1, the library is operating its own catalog: Thomas Balch Library Centennial Catalog. Staff is now working to add in maps, verify and upload periodical holding. Other collection still to be added include microforms, newspapers, and rare books. To date we have had positive and excited feedback on our change.

Personnel:

Interns/Student Researchers: An intern will be starting in August. There is a second intern, a rising senior at VCU, who will be starting in late August early September.

Staff: Staff is to be highly commended for their effort to effect the change in our cataloging system.

News of Former Staff:

Volunteers: Work on a variety of projects such as scanning and numbering photographs, rehousing collection materials and prepping collections for processing.

Donaldson Cabin:

- Taylor Ruzinsky is processing collections at the cabin grant funded.
- Laura is managing the Library's participation in First Fridays through October.
 Participation is being recorded separately in our statistics for the Donaldson Cabin

Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission Minutes 09 August 2023

Meeting convened by Hershman in lower-level meeting room, Thomas Balch Library, at 7:02 PM.

Electronic Recording Statement: It is the practice of the Town of Leesburg to record meetings of the Town's standing boards and commissions.

Virtual Participation: Coyer requested to attend the meeting virtually, a motion in favor was moved by Woolard, seconded by Baracat-Donovan and unanimously approved.

Minutes: Minutes of the regular commission meeting of 12 July 2023 were approved on a motion by Billigmeier and a second by Dias-Mattina.

Library Director: Report attached.

Friends of the Thomas Balch Library, Inc.:

- Fall issue (Vol 28 #2) of the Chronicle out and copies were distributed to Commissioners. The issue includes coverage of the Douglass High School reopening, the upcoming Friends event September 10, and an article on the Library's new catalog.
- Invitations to the Sept 10 event were sent and Commissioners were encouraged to attend.

Thomas Balch Library Endowment Foundation: Gressitt, Secretary/Treasurer reporting

- At the last meeting various expenditures, including final payment to OCLC for the catalog transition and first year fees were approved.
- Next meeting of the Foundation is 19 September 2023 @ 12 noon at Thomas Balch Library.

Old Business:

 Gressitt reporting on the Catalog Project noted the public was pleased with the new catalog, finding it easy to use. The Library is now in alignment with like

- institutions such as the Library of Virginia and George Mason University. George Mason has already approached the Library about shared grant opportunities.
- Land Acknowledgement landmark was briefly discussed and carried forward for further discussion as information arises.
- St James' Cemetery. Billigmeier and Gressitt reported on topics addressed at the initial meeting 26 July): 1) recommendation that a mapping and ground-penetrating radar (GPR) survey of the St James Cemetery lot on Church Street be conducted (RFP subsequently issued); 2) history markers including investigation of a state marker; 3) landscaping of site; and 4) Town County, private funding. Following a brief discussion, it was agreed to carry the item forward for further discussion as information arises.
- Gressitt reported that Carl Rush, Loudoun County Equity Officer and a research team from UVA met at TBL, July 24. Members of the Black History Committee and TBL staff were in attendance. The researchers will be utilizing Library and BHC resources to establish a better understand the impact of school segregation/desegregation had on members of the African American community in Loudoun County.
- History Awards Baracat-Donovan, Woolard, and Gressitt were reaffirmed as reviewers of submissions followed by a brief discussion on process. Gressitt reminded everyone that the History Awards on November 5 was the official Commission meeting that month and pictures would be taken for use on the website.

New Business: None.

Councilmanic remarks: None.

Commission Comments: None.

- Woolard is once again volunteering at the George C. Marshall House (Dodona Manor). He shared with the Commission information on an Off Duty lecture series starting September 21 @ 5:30 PM with David Robarge, Chief Historian of the Central Intelligence Agency, speaking on George C. Marshall in the Secret World.
- Hershman noted his disappointment at not being able to attend the last Foundation Board meeting nor the Douglass School opening. He was pleased that Carl Rush and UVA were working together on the segregation/desegregation issue.

On a motion by Woolard, seconded by Dias-Mattina the meeting adjourned at 7:46PM.

Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission Report 9 August 2023

- Commission voted unanimously to allow remote participation of commissioner Paul Coyer from Portugal
- Approved the minutes of the 12 July 2023
- Received the Library Director's report—the director noted the hard work of library staff
 and library volunteers in the successful re-shelving of the library's entire book collection
 following the change in cataloguing of the books—the library will have two interns
 during the late summer fall seasons—the library's exhibit at the Donaldson Cabin has
 drawn interested visitors during the Town's "First Friday" celebrations and a library
 staffer working under a grant is processing collections at the cabin.
- Don Cooper, President of the Friends of TBL, gave the Friends' report—he called attention to the recently published *The Chronicle*, their newsletter, especially to the articles on the re-cataloguing, the upcoming Friends' September fundraiser, and the rededication of Douglass School.
- Under Old Business—the commission briefly discussed the indigenous peoples state marker but decided to carry the item over until possible further action by the Town—the commission then took up a discussion of the upcoming Loudoun History Awards and decided to leave the next step to commissioners Woolard and Baracat-Donovan, who are examining the nominating documents, to make their recommendation in October—commissioner Billigmeier and library director Gressitt gave a detailed report on the meeting of the St. James' cemetery committee, noting that the cemetery, once restored, would be an enhancement of the Historical District as well as a pleasant green space amidst the buildings of the Court's Complex—the commission is interested in the project and is awaiting further studies of the site.
- New Business—none at this time.
- Under Commissioners' Comments—commissioner Woolard noted that he has returned
 as docent at the Marshall House and listed some of their upcoming events—chairman
 Hershman noted the visit to Balch of a team of researchers from the University of
 Virginia who, at the county's request, are doing a study of public school desegregation
 in Loudoun County.
