Leesburg Airport Advisory Commission August 9, 2023

Call to Order: The Meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 6:00 p.m. The Chairman introduced John Dolan as the newest member.

Approval of Minutes: July 12, 2023 minutes approved 6-0-1

Petitioners and Public Input: none

Old Business:

a. Noise Abatement Update: The Chairman updated the Commission on efforts to mitigate noise impacts at Evergreen Meadows neighborhood. The Chairman noted the efforts of the Tower personnel to favor runway 17 during calm winds and to direct right hand traffic for 35 flights whenever possible to reduce flights over Evergreen Meadows. The Chairman notes the airport is continuing to keep in contact with the residents. A concern of residents continues to be leaded fuel used in piston aircraft. Leesburg is not alone and many airport's around the country are facing similar inquiries. Mr. Fisher noted that 100LL is the only approved fuel for use in piston aircraft, although he would like to see an unleaded solution be approved for use. Promotion of the noise abatement guidelines have continued through coordination with schools and through FAASTeam safety briefings.

New Business:

• <u>Instrument Approach to Runway 35:</u> The Chairman briefed that he would like to pursue an instrument approach to runway 35. Designing a curved approach that would not interfere with IAD routes might be possible and would improve the airport capabilities. The airport director

- noted that the airport master plan does include that an approach could be added. Outreach to FAA, IAD, and Potomac Tracon will be needed to determine viability.
- <u>Air Show:</u> The airport director provided a presentation on the air show planning efforts and anticipated performers.
- Electric Aircraft Charger: The airport director presented a desire by Beta Technologies to install an electric aircraft charger at the airport. Beta is developing an electric aircraft and building a network of electric chargers at airports to support the new aircraft. Leesburg has worked with the company and FAA to identify a suitable location in a common-use area on the north apron. A charging station would be like a level-3 automobile charger, but with a cord reel to reach electric aircraft. The airport commission agreed that the airport should pursue establishing of a charger in this location.
- West-side Study: The airport director provided an update on the study being conducted regarding the development plan for the airport's west side acreage. The consultant engineer's scope of work includes determining the most reasonable development phasing, including taxiway and entrance service road as well comparing rough grading needs to determine a potential cost. The chairman recommended that Mr. Silvey and Mr. Goeller work on west side development after the work that was previously done. Some of the work would be to determine options for development and highest-best use.

Reports:

- <u>Airport Director</u> The airport director provided updates on the monthly report, projects, and noise complaints. The traffic continues to climb (20% year-to-date) which is good, but causes challenges and needs.
- FBO Comments Ms. DesMarais with ProJet inquired about the security system upgrades. The airport operations manager provided updates on the system installation on-going. He also updated on new fire knox box installation at gates 5 and 6. Ms. Arrington asked about hangar fire and why T-hangars do not have fire alarm systems. The airport director replied that fire alarm systems are not required by code in unoccupied buildings. Ms. Arrington suggested researching costs to install.
- <u>Airport Business Association Comments</u> Mr. Fisher commented that additional tie-down space is needed to meet business demand and he cannot grow this location without it.
- Chairman's Report: No additional comments.
- Committee Reports:
 - Operations: Mr. Marrero did not have any updates. Mr. Link announced that he would be leaving Leesburg for another location with RVA.
 - o Land Use and Development: Mr. Silvey commented about aircraft leaded fuel.
- Commission Member Comments: no additional comments
- Board of Supervisors Representative Report: Mr. Corcoran was not present.
- Councilmanic Comments: Councilmember Cummings was not present.
- Final Petitioners and Public Comments: none.
