Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission 13 September 2023 Library Director's Report

Outreach: Outreach for August included Laura assisting with the Brief History of Leesburg workshop by Betsy Arnett; hosting a First Friday pop-up exhibit about the history of Dogs in Leesburg at the Donaldson Cabin; providing a tour for Lara Szypszak from the Library of Congress Manuscripts division; meeting with Loudoun Museum staff about potential future collaboration. Alexandra met with Lara Szypszak of the Library of Congress to encourage future collaboration and continued to work with St. James on its Cemetery project. TBL staff collaborated or provided assistance to Town of Leesburg staff from multiple departments, as well as with Loudoun County Historic Court Records, and the Virginia Piedmont Heritage Association in July.

Collections: August 2023 Activity: Accessions: 6 gifts were accessioned.

Acquisitions of note accessioned in August included materials from the 2007 campaign of Sally Kurtz for Catoctin District Supervisor and a history of the garden at Little Oatlands, and a donation of one folder of materials related to the Eamich family of Loudoun County including deeds, photographs, and genealogical materials.

Additions to existing collections were also received including additions to the records of the Friends of Thomas Balch Library and the Town of Leesburg.

Published materials included *War on the Rapidan* by John Mark Joseph and *The Signal Corps in the War of the Rebellion* by Joseph Willard Brown.

Digital Collections, Computers, and Microfilm: 0

Manuscript and Visual Collections: 2 Manuscript collections were processed, Crossroads Change in Rural America Response Cards, 2022 (SC 0162) Goldie E. Maffett Collection (M0131) and two collections were updated with additions: Town of Leesburg Records and Charles A Johnston Collection (M0098); 83 photographs were processed; 1 records were uploaded to the Past Perfect catalog, the online version of which which currently holds 7,270 images.

Printed Collections: 309 items were cataloged; 210 items were added to the Centennial catalog and 99 newspapers were received and inventoried.

Vertical Files (VF): Additions/updates to the microform index (0) ephemera files (0), vertical files (0) unpublished papers (0); family files (0) and maps (0). Anna Carneal is working on a collection guide for the family files and a Volunteer, Ann Geiger, is assisting in re-foldering the materials.

Catalog Project: Staff is now working to add in maps, verify and upload periodical holding. Prep work is being conducted with the microform collection in advance of cataloging. Other collection still to be added include microforms, newspapers, and rare books. We continue to have positive feedback on our change.

Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission (13 September 2023)

- Approved the minutes of the 9 August meeting
- Received the library director's report—the fall schedule of classes, book talks, and tours was launched with a highly successful genealogy class on 7 September that attracted over 80 participants, the town historical tours have been limited in size for safety and management purposes, though two have scheduled spring tours to accommodate overflow demand—library exhibits will be open at the First Friday events in the fall months at the Donaldson Cabin—the catalog project continues with the inclusion of map and periodical holdings, preparation work for adding the microform collections is underway—arrangements for the presentation of the garden tree and plaque honoring Martha Schonberger are expected for the fall
- Don Cooper, President of the Friends of Thomas Balch Library reported on their 10 September fundraiser—despite adverse weather conditions, 56 persons attended (others paid but did not attend) to hear an interesting panel discussion—the Friends Board will meet next Tuesday and a revenue statement for the fundraiser should be available at that point
- Alexandra Gressitt reported that the TBL Foundation board will meet on 19 September at noon in Balch for a report on the progress of transferring the funds remaining in the century-old Balch donation to the TBL endowment fund administered by the TBL board
- Under Old and Continuing Business the commission had a discussion on the upcoming Loudoun History Awards, focusing particularly on how to better increase the public's awareness of them as we emerge from the hiatus caused by the pandemic lockdown—several ideas put forward may merit further consideration both in the short and longer term—the update regarding the St. James historic cemetery project was that the site had been mowed and cleaned well, the County had accepted its part in the preservation, and that future actions were pending—no further action had yet occurred on the indigenous peoples historic marker and the item can be carried over to a future meeting
- Under New Business, the commission took note of the vacancy on the commission and discussed the attendance requirements for commissioners
- Commissioners comments followed with the commissioners having no comments
 except for chairman Hershman who said that he had had a chance for a useful
 discussion with the team of UVA researchers working on Loudoun's history of school
 segregation and desegregation
