

Thomas Balch Library Advisory Commission Minutes 11 September 2024

Meeting convened by Hershman in lower-level meeting room, Thomas Balch Library, at 7:07 PM.

Electronic Recording Statement: It is the practice of the Town of Leesburg to record meetings of the Town's standing boards and commissions.

Virtual Attendance Request: None

Minutes: Minutes of the regular commission meeting of 10 July 2024 were approved on a motion by Baracat-Donovan seconded by Dias-Mattina.

Library Director: Report attached. Christiansen highlighted the arrival of new staff including Curator of Manuscripts and Archives Tammy Linh Tran and hiring of two new flexible part-time reference staff, Eliza Vegas and Morgan Dunwoody. She also noted the busy schedule of programs and events, and increasing attendance at events. In addition, she mentioned continuing efforts to updated statistics created at the library with the aim of generating meaningful data.

Friends of the Thomas Balch Library, Inc.:

- A new edition of The Chronicle for fall is at the printer and should be available by or before 9/20.
- The next Friends board meeting will be held on 9/17 at 9:30 am.
- The Fall fundraiser for Friends will be held on 6 October from 4-7pm at the Loudoun Heritage Farm Museum. Ann Marie Chirieleison will speak about the Tenant's Revolt of 1775/1776 in Loudoun. The cost of tickets to the event is lower than previous years. This and the location hopefully will draw more new attendees as well as more attendees from Eastern Loudoun. Tickets can be purchased online through the new FTBL website.

Thomas Balch Library Endowment Foundation: Christiansen, Secretary/Treasurer reporting

 Noted that the accountants review of the Balch Trust account at Wells Fargo had been completed. No additional updates as to status of transfer of the account. • The next meeting of the Endowment Foundation Board will be held on Tuesday September 17 at noon. At the following meeting on November 19, TD Bank will provide an investment policy update to the TBLEF Board.

Old Business:

- Library Director transition Hershman suggested that the transition was covered in the Director's Report.
- St James' Cemetery committee Billigmeier had no updates on the project.
- Commission on Performing Arts Baracat-Donovan provided updated information regarding creation of a Performing Arts Council, noting that the Council voted to move forward and detailing the next steps in the process. Commission members agreed that once formed it would be worthwhile for TBLAC to explore shared interests with both the new Commission as well as with the Commission on Public Arts.

New Business:

- Hershman noted that the Annual report (memo for council) was filed with the Town Council on August 12. He highlighted library statistics and the recovery of use of the library as well as the continuing need for additional space.
- History Awards Christiansen report on the call for nominations and response. Commissioners Dias-Mattina and Coyer will review the nominations. Procedures and planning for the November 3 award ceremony were discussed.

Councilmanic remarks: None

Commission Comments:

- Woolard noted an upcoming George Marshall International Center "Off Duty" event that will be held September 18 at St. James' Episcopal Church. The talk will feature Dr. Robert Holcomb and John H. Cook IV speaking on Two Selfless Loudoun Leaders: Dr. Claude Moore and George C. Marshall.
- Hershman commented on the renaming of the Loudoun County Court House as the Charles Hamilton Houston Courthouse on September 9. He provided insight into Houston's connection to Loudoun.

On a motion by Dias-Mattina seconded by Baracat-Donovan, the meeting adjourned at 8:29 PM.

- Received the library director's report—new staff, a manuscripts curator is
 on board as are some new flex time staff, allowing for better coverage
 during library hours—the pace of activities, talks, classes, exhibits, outreach
 efforts, has increased—attendance at events in the Donaldson Cabin on
 First Fridays has increased, First Friday in September saw 78 visitors to the
 cabin—a number of interesting new collections, some needing special
 processing, have come in—a roof leak in the library's front section was
 promptly repaired by town maintenance staff
- Don Cooper gave the Friends report—their newsletter should be out in the next few days—their fundraiser will be at the Heritage Farm Museum at the Claude Moore Park—the charge this year is \$50 per person and the date and time are: 6 October, 4-7 p.m.
- Laura Christensen gave the report from the TBL Foundation board—their next meeting will be on 17 September at noon at Balch—there will be discussion of an update the transfer of the Balch Fund to the Foundation the November meeting will feature an update on endowment investment policy
- Under Old Business—discussion of the transition in Balch leadership was
 covered in the library director's report—there was no new information on
 the St. James Cemetery project, it was carried over to the next meeting—
 the commission discussed the formation of the new Performing Arts
 Commission and commissioner Baracat-Donovan will note any areas of
 shared interest with that the new commission
- New Business—the chair reported that the annual report had been filed with the town in July—discussion followed on progress on the History Awards and commissioner Coyer was appointed to review nominees
- In commissioners comments—commissioner Woolward noted an upcoming program sponsored by Dodona Manor on the local and national leadership

of George Marshall and Claude Moore to be held at St. James church on 18 Sept. from 5:30 -7:00 p.m.—Chair Hershman discussed the renaming of the Historic Loudoun for Charles Hamilton Houston Adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

Outreach:

Exhibits:

"Faces of Ball's Bluff," from the Friends of Ball's Bluff is on display in the Mercer room at Thomas Balch Library during the month of October. This display was assembled to commemorate the 163rd anniversary of the Battle of Ball's Bluff. Its sole intention is to place a human face to the carnage that occurred here, just outside the Town of Leesburg. These stories are being told through battlefield relics, personal artifacts, and images.

Donaldson Cabin:

- September 6 Pop-up Exhibit featuring the History of the Cabin drew 78 visitors
- On September 8, the cabin hosted Diane Helentjaris for a book signing and exhibit of her new book *I Ain't Afraid The World of Lulu Bell Parr, Wild West Cowgirl* with 45 people in attendance.

Lectures and Author Talks, Classes, Tours & Other Activities:

- Heritage Dulles Presentation with Gibran Parvez on 9/8, 13 attendees
- Using Maps in Historical Research workshop with Charlie Grymes on 9/5, 28 attendees

Educational Outreach

- On 9/6 Virginia Piedmont Heritage Association brought 34 Home School students to the library for a tour and to see materials from the collection as part of a Civil War Tour of Downtown.
- TBL staff met with librarians from Riverside High School and Loudoun County High School to plan future school visits and tours of the library.

Community Collaboration:

 9/13 Maddie Russell and Laura Christiansen attended LCPL's annual staff development day conference. Maddie staffed an information table with some "Rockstar" items from TBL's collections and Laura offered an information session about Balch's collections and programs.. Overall, they engaged with over 140 LCPL staff members.

Collections:

Accessions

In September 6 accessions were received.

Donations of interest:

- On Monday 9/16 TBL staff visited the John Janney House on Cornwall Street to
 pick up a new acquisition including papers related to the Rust, Cox, Lee, Janney
 and related families. Items of note include Ida Lee Rust's Diaries which cover from
 1901 1920s and are full of amazing details about Leesburg during this time. Also
 picked up were some items which the library will digitize and return to the donor
 including a letter written by President James Monroe, correspondence from Robert
 E. Lee, and more.
- On September 27, TBL acquired a rolled map of Union Cemetery. The undated Map appears to be of early lots sold in Union with the names of lot purchasers written in ink on most lots. The map was one of several items from the estate of Billy Whitmore, a lifelong Leesburg Resident, sold at Auction by Damewood Auctioneers. Curator Tammy skillfully placed bids for the library in the online auction and won this item for a very reasonable price. The map will need cleaning and conservation work to repair some water damage and rust stains but will be an excellent addition to the collection.

Collections Use: 51 archival collections were requested and used during September.

Catalog Project:

In September Maddie created 12 original catalog records, replaced 28 incorrect records, and improved 89 local holdings records. Newly cataloged items included the following newspapers not previously cataloged:
